GENERAL REGULATIONS

A virtual information meeting will be held for registered organizations on Monday, July 17, 2023 from 3 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

DATES AND HOURS OF OPERATION

The Community Days will take place on August, Friday 11th and Saturday 12th, 2023. Each day is open to the public at 11 a.m., and close at 6 p.m. Groups can begin to set up at 10 a.m., must have finished setting up by 10:45 a.m., and must not take anything down before 6 p.m.

The material provided by Fierté Montréal will be picked up after 6 pm.

BOOTHS

Booths have a 9 m² (3x3 m) surface and are installed on Sainte-Catherine Street Est between Saint-Hubert and Papineau Streets. If an organization requires a double space or a larger one, it must submit a request to Fierté Montréal and pay the related costs.

DECORATION OF THE BOOTHS

Each organization is responsible for the costs associated with decorating its space. Organizations using their own tents must provide anchor blocks, one for each leg (20 kg per leg), and must also show proof that they have been fireproofed (conforms to CAN/ULC-S109-M «Essais de comportement au feu des tissus et pellicules ininflammables» or NFPA-701 «Standard Methods of Fire Tests for Flame-Resistant Textiles and Films»).

ELECTRICITY

No electrical supply station is provided by Fierté Montréal. Each organization is responsible for planning the needed arrangements with a nearby business to obtain electricity. In the case where a business provides an electrical connection, it must be done from the back of the booth (the cables must not cross the street), and any wiring must be secured to the ground with adhesive tape.

ECO RESPONSIBILITY

Excessive distribution of non-recyclable or non-compostable materials is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, plastic bags and promotional items contained in individual packaging.

Groups must comply with the Ville de Montréal's waste sorting requirements. Each group is responsible for ensuring their space is clean during and after the event. Fierté Montréal provides bags (waste and recycling) for each booth. Failure to comply with these regulations may jeopardize the group's future participation in the Community Days and Fierté Montréal Festival.

FUNDRAISING

Groups may -with Fierté Montréal's prior approval- sell products to raise funds for their organization, with the exception of any alcoholic product and any food cooked on-site. Fierté Montréal reserves the right to refuse the sale of certain items. This refusal could be motivated by issues of competition with neighboring businesses, the nature of the product, or by an explicit request of the local commercial promoter, the SDC du Village. It is therefore mandatory to notify Fierté Montréal in order to avoid any problems.

REFUNDS

No refund of registration fees for the Community Days will be made, except if new health restrictions are enacted. It will then be possible to request either a refund, a deferral of your registration to the 2024 edition of the Festival, or to donate to Fierté Montréal.

HARASSMENT PREVENTION AND NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

People and organizations acknowledge that they adhere to the following principles: Fierté Montréal Pride supports equal access and prohibits any form of harassment or discrimination regarding cultural affiliation, ethnic or national origin, beliefs, political convictions, income, sexual or romantic orientation, language, gender identity or expression, age except as provided by law, pregnancy, disability or use of a means to palliate that disability, neurodivergence, intersex status, relationship configuration, HIV/AIDS status, or having received a pardon.

Fierté Montréal Pride is committed to providing an environment free of bullying and harassment. In a collective effort, Fierté Montréal Pride expects everyone involved in Fierté Montréal Pride activities to be proactive in preventing harassment and bullying. No abusive behavior of any kind towards Fierté Montréal Pride staff, volunteers or members, and vice-versa, will be permitted. This includes verbal, physical, sexual and psychological abuse.

Fierté Montréal Pride reserves the right to refuse any entity that does not respect the values of the organization. Any person, organization or entity that promotes racism, xenophobia, homophobia, lesbophobia, transphobia, biphobia, serophobia or geopolitical and religious conflicts will automatically be refused and will not be allowed to participate in Fierté Montréal Pride activities.

No weapons are permitted, including firearms.
